Book Review

Hop to It By Edyta Sitar

Hop to it, by Edyta Sitar, is the book I am reviewing this month. It is an older book—published in 2009, but it has lovely applique designs. Ms. Sitar gives good ideas for selecting fabric for a new quilt. You should always choose a small scale print, a medium scale print, a large scale print, a stripe, and a polka dot. These elements will add interest to your quilt. Instructions are given for both hand applique and machine applique.

Ms. Sitar became interested in fabric at an early age. This started her on a sewing career. She

designed beautiful gowns. After her marriage, she was introduced to quilting by both her mother-in-law and grandmotherin-law. These ladies taught Ms. Sitar the basics of quilting.

The book contains some designs that may be copied and used in a variety of projects. I think any of you would find something of interest in this book. If you make a project from this book, be sure and bring your new project to the guild.



Chocolate-Cherry Cake

December 2024

by Wayland G. Abernathy, Jr

Time: 30 Minutes Ser

Serves: 12



Enter K-C ONLINE

Ingredients: 1 box, Devils Food Cake Mix 1 can, 21oz Cherry Pie Filling eggs 1 tsp Almond Extract

Place all ingredients in a bowl & beat 2 minutes. NOTE: For chunkier cherries, mix by hand.

Pour batter into a greased 9×13 cake pan.

Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes. Test for doneness with a toothpick.

Remove from oven to a wire rack to cool.

Frost with your favorite frosting, whipped cream, or serve warm, with ice cream.

Frosting ~ Over medium heat, mix together:

>1 cup powdered sugar>5 Tbls soft butter>1/3 cup milk>1 cup semisweet chocolate chips>Add 1 tsp. vanilla & 1/4 cup cocoa; cook 1-2 minutes, stirring constantly.>Immediately spread over warm cake.



QUILTOLOGY – DECEMBER 2024 >>CHRISTMAS GIFT MUG RUG<<

Supplies for 7" x 11" Mug Rug: Backing Fabric, 8" x 12" Cotton Batting, 8" x 12" (Polyester COULD) melt) Background Fabric, 12" x 12" Five Christmas Scrap Fabrics for the Tree Scrap Fabric for Tree Trunk; Gift Box, Lid & Bow 1 yd, Binding 1 Gold Star-Shaped Button 1 Purchased or Handmade 2-3" Bow Scissors or Rotary Cutter & Mat & Basic Sewing Tools: Sewing Machine, Iron, Pins, Thread, Rulers, Markers, etc. *All seams are measured at 1/4"

Abbreviations:

Background Fabric (BGF) Christmas Tree Fabric (CTF) Gift Box Lid Fabric (GBLF) Gift Box Interior Fabric (GBIF)

STEP-1: Prepare the Backing Section:

>Cut & press Backing Fabric; Lay it flat, wrong-side-up.

- >Cut the Batting; Lay it flat, on top of the Backing.
- >Set aside until both Units of the Mug Rug are finished.

STEP-2: Prepare Unit #1, the Christmas Tree Section:

>There are 8 rows to Unit #1, beginning at the top of the Unit.

- >To join the (BGF) & the (CTF) in each Row, note "Figure-1".
 - >Position one (BGF) strip on the corner of the (CTF), right sides together.
 - >Sew a diagonal line from corner to corner.
 - >Press the seams flat, creating a sharp point; Trim excess fabric.

>Repeat on the opposite corner of the (CTF), right sides together.

> **Row-1:** From (BGF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 7" piece.

> **Row-2:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 3+5/8" pieces.

>From (CTF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 2+1/2" piece.

>Attach (BGF) pieces to (CTF), as shown in Figure-1; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat.

>Attach Rows-1 & 2 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat.


> **Row-3:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 3" pieces.


>From (CTF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 3+3/8" piece.

>Attach (BGF) pieces to (CTF), as shown in Figure-1; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat.

>Attach Rows-1, 2, & 3 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat.









- > **Row-4:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 2+1/2" pieces. >From (CTF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 4+1/2" piece. >Attach (BGF) pieces to (CTF), as shown in Figure-1; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat. >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, & 4 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat. > **Row-5:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 2+1/4" pieces. >From (CTF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 5+1/2" piece. >Attach (BGF) pieces to (CTF), as shown in Figure-1; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat.
 - >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, 4, & 5 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat.
- > **Row-6:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 1+3/4" pieces.
 - >From (CTF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 6+3/8" piece.
 - >Attach (BGF) pieces to (CTF), as shown in Figure-1; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat.
 - >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat.
- > **Row-7:** From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 3+1/4" pieces.
 - >From Tree Trunk Fabric, cut & press one, 1+1/2" square piece.
 - >Attach (BGF) pieces to Tree Trunk Fabric at each side of square; Cut excess fabric & press seams flat.
 - >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, & 7 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat.
- > **Row-8:** From (BGF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 7" piece. >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, & 8 together, with right-sides-together; Press seam flat. >Square up the finished Unit & press. Unit #1 should measure approximately 6+1/2" x 7+1/2".
- > NOTE: DO NOT attach Star-Shaped Button until Mug Rug has been quilted! Then stitch, pin, or glue it onto the top of the tree.


STEP-3: Prepare Unit #2, the Gift Box Section:

> There are 4 rows to Unit #2, beginning at the top of the Unit:

> **Row-1:** From (BGF), cut & press one, 2+1/2" x 5+1/2" x piece.

- > Row-2: Gift Box Lid: From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" square pieces. >From the Gift Box Lid Fabric (GBLF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 3+1/2" piece. >Attach a 1+1/2" (BGF) square to each end of the (GBLF) strip; Press seam flat. >Attach Rows-1 & 2 together, with right-sides-together; Press seams flat.
- > Row-3: Gift Box: From (BGF), cut & press two, 1+1/2" x 3+1/2" pieces.
 - >From Gift Box Fabric (GBF), cut & press one, 3+1/2" square piece.
 - >From Gift Box Interior Fabric (GBIF), cut & press one, 3+1/2" square piece, & one, 3+1/2" x 4" piece.
 - >With right-sides-together, stitch the 3+1/2" square (GBF) & the 3+1/2" square (GBIF) piece together: Flip right-side-out & press.
















- >Lay the 3+1/2" x 4" piece of (GBIF), right-side-up & the Gift Box, right-side-up, together. (GBIF), should be 1/2" taller than the Gift Box.
- >Attach a 1+1/2" x 3+1/2" (BGF) strip to each side the Gift Box; Press seam flat.
- >Attach Rows-1, 2, & 3 together, with right-sides-together; Press seams flat.
- >There should be a 1/4" space between the Gift Box & the Gift Box Lid, showing the Interior Fabric.

> **Row-4:** From (BGF), cut & press one, 1+1/2" x 5+1/2" x piece.

- >Attach Rows-1, 2, 3, & 4 together, with right-sides-together; Press seams flat.
- > Square up the finished Unit & press. Unit #2 should measure approximately 5+1/2" x 7+1/2".

STEP-4: Join the Units:

- >With right-sides-together, stitch both Units together; Press seam flat.
- >Layer Backing, Batting & Mug Rug Top together.
- >Quilt using your favorite method; Hand, Machine, etc.
- >Bind Mug Rug.

STEP-5: Finish:

- >Attach Star-Shaped Button; stitch, pin, or glue it on.
- >Attach Bow on top of Gift Box; stitch, pin, or glue it on.
- >Place a Gift Card inside the Gift Box.
- >Wrap it up & present it to your favorite person!

*Don't forget to sew on a label!
