

Book Review Connectors Collection By Mary Ellen Hopkins

The book I am reviewing this month is "Connectors Collection" by Mary Ellen Hopkins. She starts out with a page of what you need to know to start, including fabric to select. I suggest you look at the back cover before you start. It is a picture of a quilt made of all these "connectors" she is writing about. I get the impression there was a book before this one which I know nothing about. Mary Ellen has named these connectors which are simple to make. She'd then makes rows of them to make a row of a quilt. She put them together to make very interesting quilts.

I think if you browse through the book and see the finished quilts which look complicated and then go back and read the simple instructions how to make these blocks you will find they are not that hard to make. The finished project looks nothing like the single block. The color you use for each block certainly affects the final look.



#1~#2~#3
(AKA: Liquid Starch)

Moonshine Recipe DIY Fabric Starch 1, 1 Gallon of Distilled Water 2. ½ Cup liquid starch (like Sta-Flo) 3, 1 Cup Vodka (The cheaper the better) 4. Optional: A couple drops of your favorite essential oil for smell.

Quilter's Moonshine

Recipe #1:

1 Gallon of Distilled Water

½ Cup liquid starch (like Sta-Flo)

1 Cup Vodka (The cheaper the better)

2-3 drops essential oil, orange, peppermint, etc. ~ Optional

Recipe #2:

Mix 1/3 cup vodka & 2/3 cup water in a glass spray bottle; Shake & Spray.

Recipe #3:

Mix one part vodka: Two parts water; in a glass spray bottle; Shake to combine.














QUILTOLOGY – January 2025 Winter Wonder Mug Rug ~ 8" x 12"

Supplies for 8" x 12" Mug Rug:

Backing Fabric: 9"x13" *All seams are measured at 1/4"

Cotton Batting: 9"x13" (Polyester COULD) melt)

Coordinating, Winter-Scene Fabric: 8+1/2"x10+1/2" *All measurements are length (Up & Down)

Snowball Fabrics: Sixteen (16), 2+1/2" squares by width (Side to Side)

Narrow Binding: 1+1/2 yd

Scissors or Rotary Cutter; Mat & Basic Sewing Tools

STEP-1: Prepare the Backing Section:

- > Cut & press Backing Fabric; Lay it flat, WRONG-SIDE-UP.
- > Cut the Batting; Lay it flat, on top of the Backing.
- > Set aside until the top of the Mug Rug is finished.

STEP-2: Prepare the Snowball Unit:

- > There are 16, 2+1/2" (2" finished), squares making up the Snowball unit. Position them anyway you like.
- > With right-sides together, sew 4 squares in each row. Press seams flat.
- > With right-sides together, sew the 4 rows together. Press seams flat.
- > Cut the 4 corner squares in half diagonally, creating Half-Square-Triangles (HSTs).

Do **NOT** leave a seam allowance.

> Set aside until the Coordinating, Winter-Scene Fabric is finished.

STEP-3: Prepare the Coordinating, Winter-Scene Fabric Unit:

- > Cut & press the Winter-Scene Fabric at LEAST 8+1/2"x10+1/2".
- > Lay the piece flat, RIGHT-SIDE-UP.
- > Lay the Snowball Unit over the LEFT-EDGE of the Winter-Scene Fabric, ensure the Snowball Unit completely covers the edge.
- > Lay the binding flat along the RIGHT-EDGE of the Snowball Unit, from the top of the top-right HST, down the two right squares, & down the edge of the bottom HST.

STEP-4: Join the Units:

- > Layer Backing, Batting & Mug Rug Top together.
- > The design is mine, the quilting is YOURS!!! Quilt using your favorite method ~ Hand, Machine, etc.
- > Bind Mug Rug.

*Don't forget to sew on a label!
