#### **New Business:**

<u>Duane Carpentier:</u> The Patriotic Bee won a \$3750 grant from the Ride of Honor Foundation for their Quilts of Valor work.

<u>Nadezda Pshenitsyna:</u> Mystery Quilt program for 2025 will be starting in April. See her for more information on fabric and color choices.

<u>Duane Carpentier:</u> The guild challenge for the first half of 2025 is Applique. All quilts should be 24 inches by 24 inches or larger and they are due at the June meeting. Duane is available on Open Sew Saturdays for applique tips.

<u>Jinx Abernathy:</u> A Comfort Bag construction walkthrough was demonstrated. 1 yard of fabric can be made into 3 Comfort Bags.

#### **Upcoming Monthly Programs:**

March: "Yardsale", with all proceeds to the original owners, of fabrics etc.

May: There will be a "Perfecting Piecing with Flying Geese" workshop, by Lee Monroe of May Chappell Designs.

#### Monthly Program: Quilting Bee History and Current Bees

In the late 1700s, the quilting bee was intended as a meeting of neighbors to unite labor for the benefit of one person. Bees became less popular after the 1920s. Online quilting bees became more popular during covid as a social outlet. We have 5 active bees with 42 active members.

**Busy Bees:** Covers a variety of crafts and projects, ex: yoyo tree, shoebox project, placemats for Meals on Wheels, QOV quilt collaborations. 11 active members. Meets at the Braswell Memorial Library on the 2nd Tuesday of each month @ 10 am. Queen Bee is Lisa Clark.

**Cutting Corners:** Learning bee dedicated to skill acquisition, ex: comfort bags, fabric ornaments, stained glass tutorial, glue basting. Members take turns giving various tutorials. Braswell Library on the 3rd Friday of the month @ 10 am. Queen Bee is Ramona Orzell. **Happy Hoopers:** Covers machine embroidery projects, ex: embroidered quilts, towels, monograms. Small group. Meetings are held on 3rd Saturday of each month @ 10 am at the home of Frankie Powell. Queen Bee is Frankie Powell.

**Sew-Social:** Open Sew Format @ the Imperial Art Center on the 4th Saturday of each month. Open to all members. Door to the Education Building is open at 9:30AM. Building closes at 4 pm. Queen Bee is Pam Smith.

**EQ8 Electric Quilt:** digital program for making quilts via mockups. Currently an inactive bee. Can ask Duane Carpentier for help. **Patriotic Bee:** The goal is to help veterans, ex: Quilt of Valor quilts, walker bags. Meeting time is usually used to make items. Jinx and Pat have a library of patterns. Meets at the Braswell Library on the 1st Tuesday of each month at 10 am. Queen Bee is Jennie Wright.


## **Book Review Quick Classic Quilts** By Marsha McCloskey

Quick Classic Quilts by Marsha McCloskey is this month's book review. Though the book was published in 2007, it is a very basic quilt book and is quite relevant to making quilts today. There are two blocks I hope to try in the near future. One is a feathered star medallion; the other is a radiant star. I plan to just make a block of each, not a whole quilt! A friend told me that she had made a feathered star block from her directions and that it turned out well.

At the beginning of the book, Mrs. McCloskey says that she got her first sewing machine as a child. She says it was a toy sewing machine with a hand crank. She made doll clothes with it and didn't get a real sewing machine until she was going to college. I am amazed that she stuck with sewing. She has gone on to have a great career teaching others how to make guilts.

In the book she gives the directions for many classic quilts, e.g. Log Cabin, Flying Geese, Burgoyne Surrounded, Sawtooth Star, and the basic Four Patch. She says that

alternating blocks is one of her strategies in designing quilts. She shows a quilt she made alternating a Schoolhouse block with Old Maid's Puzzle, a block I was not familiar with. The combination makes a very pleasing quilt. The directions for each quilt include making various sized quilts. She tells how to rotary cut the pieces and then gives a template so that one can compare the pieces for accuracy before piecing. I think this is a great book to add to your collection.

APRIL: QUILT RESTORATION AND REPAIR WITH CATHY SMITH

MAY: LEE MONROE PERFECTING PIECING WITH FLYING GEESE

#### Welcome to the 2025 Mystery Quilt Challenge!

We will kick off in April, and piece and assemble the top by January (finished size: 61 x 61 in). There will be 10 clues in total, this first being the selection of fabrics. Each month you will receive another clue explaining a few simple steps to advance with the quilt. The main technique used is half-square triangles (HST). I hope this process helps you learn new techniques along the way and have fun too!

Clue 1: Pick your fabrics.

This mystery quilt features a background fabric and 4 colors:

- Background (2 yards)
- Color A (3/4 yard)
- Color B (3/4 yard)
- Color C (3/4 yard)
- Color D (1...1/8 yard)

#### Fabric options:

Option 1: You can pick the background and 4 coordinating fabrics. Fabric B is good for showcasing a large or medium size print (if desired), while fabrics A, C and D would be better with a small print or solids.

Option 2: Instead of picking four single fabrics, each of the same pattern, you can use four colorways for a scrappier look. Assemble the total amount of each A, B, C and D from similar colorways (for example, reds, greens, yellows, blues etc). Option 3: Using background and 2 main colorways (for example Red, Blue and White). My suggestion would be to have fabrics A and C in one main color, B and D in another main color, and white as the background.

Option 4: For ombre effect, my suggestion would be to arrange colors from the darkest to the lightest (or from the lightest to the darkest) as A to B to C to D.

#### A Quilter's Tale



### March Madness March 2025

TIME: 30 minutes YIELD: 2 dozen

**Ingredients:** 

1 package, 8 refrigerated crescent rolls

1 small apple, peeled, cored & cut into 24 thin slices

6 pieces sliced Gouda cheese, quartered (24 pieces)

24 smoked cocktail sausages

Honey Mustard



#### **Directions:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°.
- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper; set aside.
- 3. Unroll crescent rolls & separate into 8 triangles.
- 4. Cut each crescent triangle lengthwise into 3 thin triangles.
- 5. On the wide end of each triangle, place 1 apple slice, 1 piece quartered cheese slice, & 1 smoked sausage; roll tightly.
- 6. Place the rolls, point side down, 1" apart on the baking sheet.
- 7. Bake until golden brown, 10-12 minutes.
- 8. Serve with Honey Mustard.

#### QUILTOLOGY - March 2025

March Winds Blow Mug Rug - 8"x10"

\*All seams are measured at 1/4"

#### Supplies for 8"x 10" Mug Rug:

Backing Fabric: 9"x11"

Cotton Batting: 9"x11" (Polyester COULD) melt)

Background Fabric: 9"x11"

Coordinating Fabric Scraps, 3" squares Heat 'n Bond Lite Iron-on Adhesive

Binding: about 40"-43"

Purchased 1" Fashion Button

Scissors or Rotary Cutter; Cutting Mat & Basic Sewing Tools





#### STEP-1: Prepare the Backing Section:

- > Cut & press Backing Fabric; lay it flat, WRONG-SIDE-UP.
- > Cut the Batting; lay it flat, on top of the Backing.
- > Cut & press Background Fabric; lay it flat, RIGHT-SIDE-UP, on top of the Batting.
- > Pin or clip the Backing Section & set aside until the Whirlygig Pattern is finished.

#### STEP-2: Prepare the Whirlygig Pattern:

- > Cut two 3" squares out of each Coordinating Fabrics.
- > Stack the four Coordinating squares together.
- > Cut the 3" squares in half, diagonally = eight half-square triangles.
- > Alternating colors, sew the triangles together, as shown.
- > Turn raw edges under & press.
- > Cut the Heat 'n Bond to fit the Whirlygig Pattern.
- > Press the Heat 'n Bond to the Whirlygig, according to package instructions.

#### STEP-3: Prepare the Top Section:

- > Place the Whirlygig Pattern where you want it on top of the Backing Section; pin in place.
- > Cut a piece of binding 2" to 3" long; place one end under the Whirlygig Pattern, as the "stick"; pin in place.
- > When you find the placement you like, remove the paper from the back of the Whirlygig & press in place.
- > Applique around the Whirlygig Pattern & the "stick".
- Quilt the mug rug with any design you like.

#### STEP-4: Final Touches to the Mug Rug:

- > Bind the mug rug.
- > Hand stitch the purchased Button in the center of the Whirlygig Pattern. FINISHED!


