

2025 Mystery Quilt Clue 8

This is the final clue for this Mystery quilt. I hope you enjoyed the process!

Cutting:

- From the background fabric, cut 6 strips across the width of fabric, 2 inch wide, for the inner border.
- From Color D, cut 6 strips across the width of fabric for the outer border, 4.5 inch wide.
- From Color C, cut 6 width-of-fabric strips 2.5 inch, for binding.

Piecing:

Assemble following the chart, add narrow inner border, then wide outer border, quilt as desired and bind.



Book Review Paper Piecing with Alex Anderson By Alex Anderson

If you have not yet started on a paper pieced project for the guild, you still have time. Paper Piecing with Alex Anderson has seven projects that would be perfect for your presentation. Most are smaller quilts. There is a Pineapple quilt that is 42 ½ x 50 ½", a Kaleidoscope quilt that is 52 ½" x 56 ½". This one has a unique border that is very appealing. The guilt uses lots of scraps. The New York Beauty quilt is 39 ½" x 39 ½", a very colorful sampler quilt that is 40 ½" x 40 ½". It features a square in a square, kaleidoscope, basket, New York Beauty and Pineapple blocks. Paper Piecing simplifies the construction of each of these patterns. With paper piecing the quilter is given a pattern. You make enough copies of the pattern to construct the block. Since you will be sewing on the paper, your pattern should be very accurate. You need to shorten your stitch length before you begin. When the quilt is completed, the paper needs to be torn away. Small tweezers are a big help. Ms. Anderson suggests several types of paper you might use. I prefer the Carol Doak paper. It tears away rather easily.



This book is full of tips and techniques to make you a successful paper-piecer. Some love paper piecing; others do not. I like it because of the accuracy I have.







2 cups Gingersnap crumbs

1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted

1/3 cup granulated sugar

Crust:

No-Bake Pumpkin Cheesecake

November 2025 ~ Courtesy Jinx Abernathy

Total Time: 8 hrs 30 mins Makes One 10" cake, to Serve 10-12

Filling:

1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin purée
1 cup heavy cream
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp ground nutmeg
1 cup powdered sugar
2 Tbls molasses
1/8 tsp ground cardamom
1/8 tsp ground cloves

1 tsp vanilla extract

Step-1: Drain the pumpkin in a small bowl lined with paper towels: Set aside.

Step-2: In a large bowl or food processor, combine the Gingersnap crumbs, sugar, & melted butter until all the crumbs are evenly moistened & the mixture begins to clump together.

- > Transfer the crumb mixture into a 9 or 10" Springform pan: Pack the crumbs firmly into an even layer on the bottom & slightly up the sides of the pan.
- > Transfer the pan to the freezer to chill while preparing the filling.
- Step-3: Whip the heavy cream until thickened & very stiff peaks form, about 1-2 minutes.
 - > Transfer the whipped cream to a small bowl & set aside.
- **Step-4:** Whip the cream cheese until completely smooth, about 4 minutes.
 - > Add the drained pumpkin, powdered sugar, molasses, vanilla, & spices.
 - > Mix on the lowest speed until most of the powdered sugar has been incorporated into the mixture, about 1 minute.
 - > Increase the speed to medium-high & whip for 2-3 minutes, or until the filling is creamy, smooth, & free of lumps.
- **Step-5:** Gently fold the whipped cream into the pumpkin mixture.
- **Step-6:** Remove the crust from the freezer & fill it with the pumpkin mixture.
 - > Using a small offset spatula, level & smooth the top of the cake.
 - > Cover the pan tightly with a layer of plastic wrap, do not let the plastic touch the surface of the cake.
 - > Refrigerate until thoroughly chilled & filling has set, at least 8 hours, ideally 12 to 24 hours.
- **Step-7:** When cake is set & ready to serve, run a small offset spatula around the edge of the cake.
 - > Remove the rim of the pan & carefully slide the cake onto a serving plate. Slice & serve.
 - **NOTE:** > Decorate with Whipped Cream, Caramel, or Chocolate Sauce, if desired.
 - > Leftover cheesecake can be covered & stored in the refrigerator up to 3 days.
 - > This cheesecake also freezes well:
 Cut slices & freeze them, spaced apart, on a baking sheet.
 Wrap individual slices tightly & freeze up to 3 months.
 Ever try eating FROZEN Cheese Cake? YUM!!!
