COMFORT BAGS ~ 45 minutes (Makes 3 bags)

SUPPLIES:

1 yard Juvenile Fabric *NOTE:* If using flannel, or ANY fabric you're not sure of, PRE-WASH!!! Sewing machine & basic sewing tools



Suggested Fillers for Comfort Bags:

Activity ~ Coloring ~ or Reading Book Ball Point Pen Colored Pencils or Crayons Eraser 12" square Mini Comfort Quilt Notebook or Writing Tablet Small, Stuffed Animal or Toy Tissue Pack

1. Trim off selvages; cut Fabric 33-36" long; divide Fabric lengthwise, into 3 equal widths, approximately 14"x33-36".

NOTE: Fabric widths will vary, depending on the width of fabric, after trimming selvages. **NOTE:** Comfort Bags should "finish" NO LESS THAN 12" square.

- 2. With Fabric WRONG-SIDE-UP, fold both Top & Bottom hems up 1" & press. Fold BOTH hems up another 1" & press. Top Stitch along top & bottom edges of BOTH Hems, for added strength.
- **3.** With RIGHT-SIDE-UP, fold Bottom of Bag up 12-13" & press. Fold Top of Bag down 3-4", covering bottom edge of bottom hem & press.
- **4.** If this is a Donation item, sew on the TRPQG label. Center on the front of the bag, about 1 / 2" below the bottom of the hem.

NOTE: Certainly, you can sew in the label on the FINISHED Comfort Bag BUT, it's MUCH easier to sew in the label now, while the bag is still FLAT.

5. FRENCH SEAM:

- > With RIGHT-SIDE of bag facing up & bag closed, sew a 1/4" seam down both side-edges. Trim seam to 1/8".
- > Turn bag WRONG-SIDE-OUT, press seam flat.
- > ~Sew a 1/4" seam on WRONG-SIDE of bag, being sure to enclose first seam.
- > ~Turn bag RIGHT-SIDE-OUT, press & fill bag.
