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Project: Flying Geese Quilt

INSPIRED BY FLIGHT OF GEESE FROM DESIGNER VICKIE EAPEN (SPUNSUGARQUILT.COM) QUILT TESTER: JAN RAGALLER



Sew Flying Geese blocks to make a soothing quilt using an assortment of blue and green batiks. Fabrics are Ceylon, Key Lime, and Chamomile fat-quarter bundles from Hoffman California Fabrics (hoffmanfabrics.com).

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Materials

- 6½ yards total assorted green, blue, and chartreuse batiks (blocks, setting rectangles, binding) (The featured quilt uses 10 green batiks, 11 blue batiks, and 9 chartreuse batiks)
- 3½ yards backing fabric
- 69" square batting

Finished quilt: 60½" square Finished block: 6½×3½"

Quantities are for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics. Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides

together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

From assorted green batiks, cut:

■ 100—3½×6½" setting rectangles

From remaining green batiks and assorted blue and chartreuse batiks, cut:

- 13—2**½**×20" binding strips
- 100—3½×6½" rectangles
- 200—3½" squares (100 sets of 2 matching squares)

Assemble Blocks

- Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each 3½" square. (To prevent fabric from stretching as you draw lines, place 220-grit sandpaper under each square.)
- 2. For one Flying Geese block you will need two matching 3½" squares and one contrasting print 3½×6½" rectangle.


- 3. Align a marked square with one end of 3½×6½" rectangle (Block Assembly Diagram; note direction of drawn line). Sew on drawn line, then trim excess, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam toward triangle.
- 4. In same manner, add matching marked square to opposite end of rectangle (Block Assembly Diagram; again note direction of drawn line). Stitch, trim, and press as before to make a Flying Geese block. The block should be 6½×3½" including seam allowances.
- **5.** Repeat steps 2-4 to make 100 Flying Geese blocks total.

Assemble Quilt Top

- 1. Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram for placement, lay out Flying Geese blocks and remaining 3½×6½" setting rectangles in 20 rows.
- Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams toward setting rectangles.
- **3.** Join rows to complete quilt top. Press seams in one direction.


Finish Quilt

- **1.** Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- Sew together assorted batik 2½×20" binding strips to make a pieced binding strip. Bind with pieced binding strip.
