Mary Selecky called the TRPQG meeting to order at 09:30 am and welcomed everyone. Mary wished Happy Birthday to all with a birthday in June.

A motion to approve the Meeting Minutes for May was made by Pam Smith and seconded by Katherine Saunders. A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report for May was made by Duane Carpentier and seconded by Harvey Sopher. Both motions passed.

Committee Reports:

Charity Outreach: Katherine Saunders: Delivery was made to the Christian Adoption Agency and local hospital. 2 bags were donated to the Wilson Veteran's association. Comfort bags are still being solicited for EMTs/police. Julie Green will be doing the presentation of Quilts of Valor to the Harley Riders association. For a Quilts of Valor presentation to happen at the guild, at least 10 quilts need to be turned in by August. Challenge: Foundation Paper Piecing

Try a new technique, or add to the skills you already have, with Foundation Paper Piecing.

What Is FPP?

Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP) is a quilting technique where a printed paper template guides fabric placement and stitching to create precise quilt blocks. The fabric is sewn onto the paper, and the paper is removed after the block is completed.

The criteria is simple.

Use whatever combination of colors and pattern(s) you like.

Size: at least 24 inches Square

Must be made using foundation paper piecing Technique. (definition above)

Finished quilts must be submitted at the December TRPQG meeting.

HAVE FUN AND CREATE!!

If you have any questions, feel free to reach out to the leadership team.

2025 Mystery Quilt Clue 4

Cutting:

From the background fabric, cut 3 squares 8 x 8 inch. From Color C, cut 3 squares 8 x 8 inch. Keep leftover fabric after each clue – you may need it later!

Piecing:

Eight-at-a-time HST technique.

- 1) Place the two squares (one background and one color C) together, right sides facing. With a pencil, mark two diagonal lines on the wrong side of one square.
- 2) Pin the squares together, ready to sew.
- 3) Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ inch on both sides of each marked line.
- 4) Cut along the two marked lines.
- 5) Cut in half horizontally.
- 6) Cut in half vertically.
- 7) Separate out into 8 half-square triangle units (HSTs).
- 8) Press seam allowances towards a darker fabric.
- 9) Trim each unit to measure 3.5 inch square, being careful to keep the diagonal seam running from corner to corner in the middle of the units (i.e. don't trim just two sides, trim all four sides).
- 10) Repeat with remaining cut squares to make 24 HSTs. Put HSTs in a ziplock bag marked Clue 4.

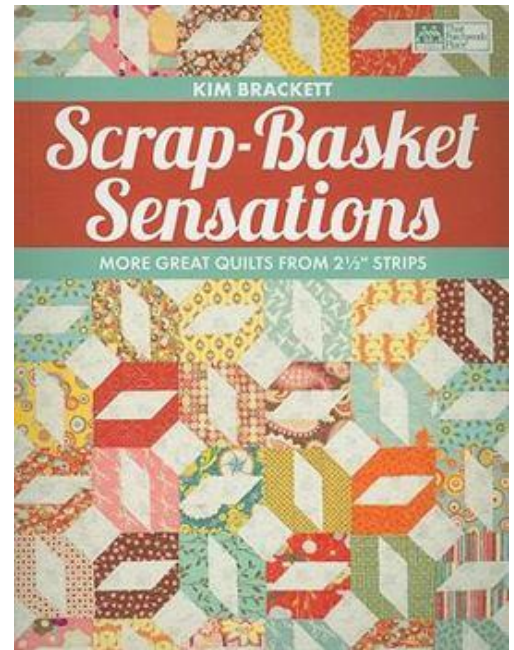
Book Review

Scrap-Basket Sensations

By Kim Brackett

The book I'm reviewing this month is Scrap-Basket Sensations by Kim Brackett. The book uses 2 1/2" strips for each of the quilts. You can cut your own strips from scraps that you probably have on hand. The author suggests that if you do this, choose a theme. Go through your scraps and pull out all the fabrics you have that use that theme. Then go through the rest of your fabrics and pull some colors that blend with the themed fabrics. She has chosen to use mostly batik fabrics, but the same process could be used for other fabrics.

There are eighteen quilts shown in the book. I made note of a couple that I would like to try. I am trying to whittle down my stash, so I prefer to piece from my stash. The background fabric I will probably need to purchase. The directions appear to be straightforward. The book has general quilting tips as well as some special techniques, e.g. folded-corner units and split units. I was happy to see her directions for making mitered-corner borders. I don't use this technique very often but it is most attractive. Perhaps I will give it another try and see if I can become more proficient at it. Give this book a try and see if you can make a dent in your stash!

At our August meeting, Lee Monroe will host a workshop from 10AM – 4PM. The cost is \$30 and will include a pattern for the workshop. Here is a supply list for the workshop.

SUPPLIES

	FINISHED SIZE	PRINT	BACKGROUND*	BACKING	BINDING
Runner	16 x 64"	1/3 yard of two fabrics	1 yard	1 yard	3/8 yard
Throw	64 x 64"	1/3 yard of eight fabrics	4 yards	4 yards	1/2 yard
Twin	64 x 96"	1/3 yard of twelve fabrics	6 yards	6 yards	2/3 yard
Double/ Queen	96 x 96"	1/3 yard of eighteen fabrics	82/3 yards	82/3 yards	7/8 yard
King	112 x 112"	1/3 yard of twenty-five fabrics	131/3 yards	131/3 yards	1 yard

Fabric Supplies:

- Use the pattern chart for fabric needs for the size quilt you desire.
- Bring at least 1/3 yard of two prints and 1/2 yard of background to class.

Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary Cutter
- Ruler (8 1/2 x 12 1/2 or similar recommended)

Optional Supplies*

- Bloc Loc 2 x 4" Flying Geese Ruler
- Bloc Loc 4 x 8" Flying Geese Ruler
- 12" or similar rotating mat

May Chappell Cane Creek Quilt Pattern

Traditional Sewing Supplies: Snips, Pins, Seam Ripper, etc.

* Bring these flying geese bloc loc rulers if you already own them. You may also bring any other flying geese trimming tools you have. There will be rulers at class for you to try; there is no need to purchase prior to class.

CUT PRIOR TO CLASS

You will need at least 1/3 yard of two prints and 1/2 yard of background for class.

Prints

- (4) 5 1/2" Square of Print A
- (1) 9 1/2" Squares of Print B

- (16) 3 1/8" Squares
- (4) 5 1/8" Squares

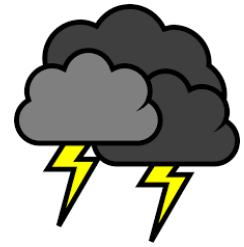

QUILTOLOGY – July 2025
4th of July Star Mug Rug - approximately 13" square

Supplies for 13" Mug Rug:

- 4-Red, 3-White, 3-Blue, 9"x3" Strips of Fabric,
- 10-Total
- 1-16" square Backing Fabric
- 1-16" square Fusible Fleece



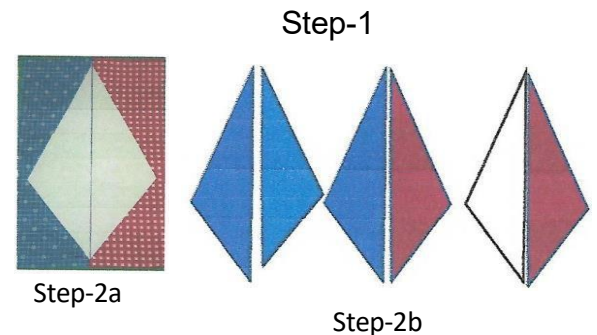
STEP-1: Prepare the Star Points:

- > With right sides together, place one BLUE strip on top of another BLUE strip.
- > Sew a 1/4" seam allowance along one 9" side; Press seams open.
- > Repeat with one BLUE & one RED strip.
- > Repeat with three WHITE & three RED strips.
- > You now have 5-sets of 6"x9" rectangles.



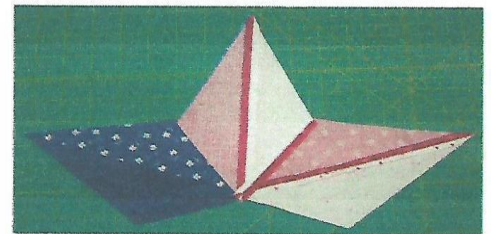
STEP-2: Making the Star Points:

- > Align the center-line of the template on the center seam of the BLUE on BLUE rectangle.
- > Trace the template & cut out the Star Point.
- > Repeat for remaining 4-rectangles.
- > Follow the picture of the completed Mug Rug for color placement of each Star Point.
- > You will need three WHITE & RED points; Ensure the WHITE is on the left side when the longer portion of the point is at the top.



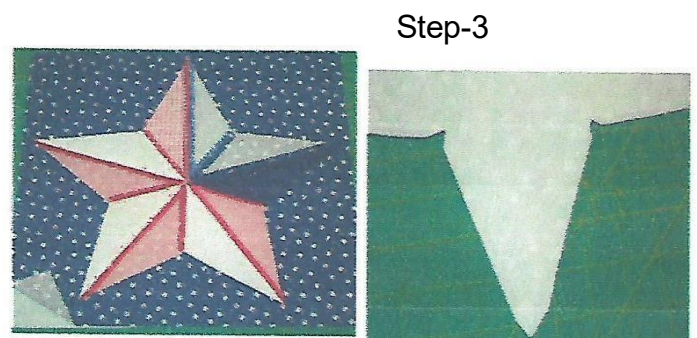
STEP-3: Connecting Points:

- > Sew Points together by aligning the lower, shorter portion of each Point.
- > Press each seam open as you join them, seams open.
- > Complete Star shape by sewing last point to the first Point.
- > Press thoroughly.



STEP-4: Assemble the Mug Rug:

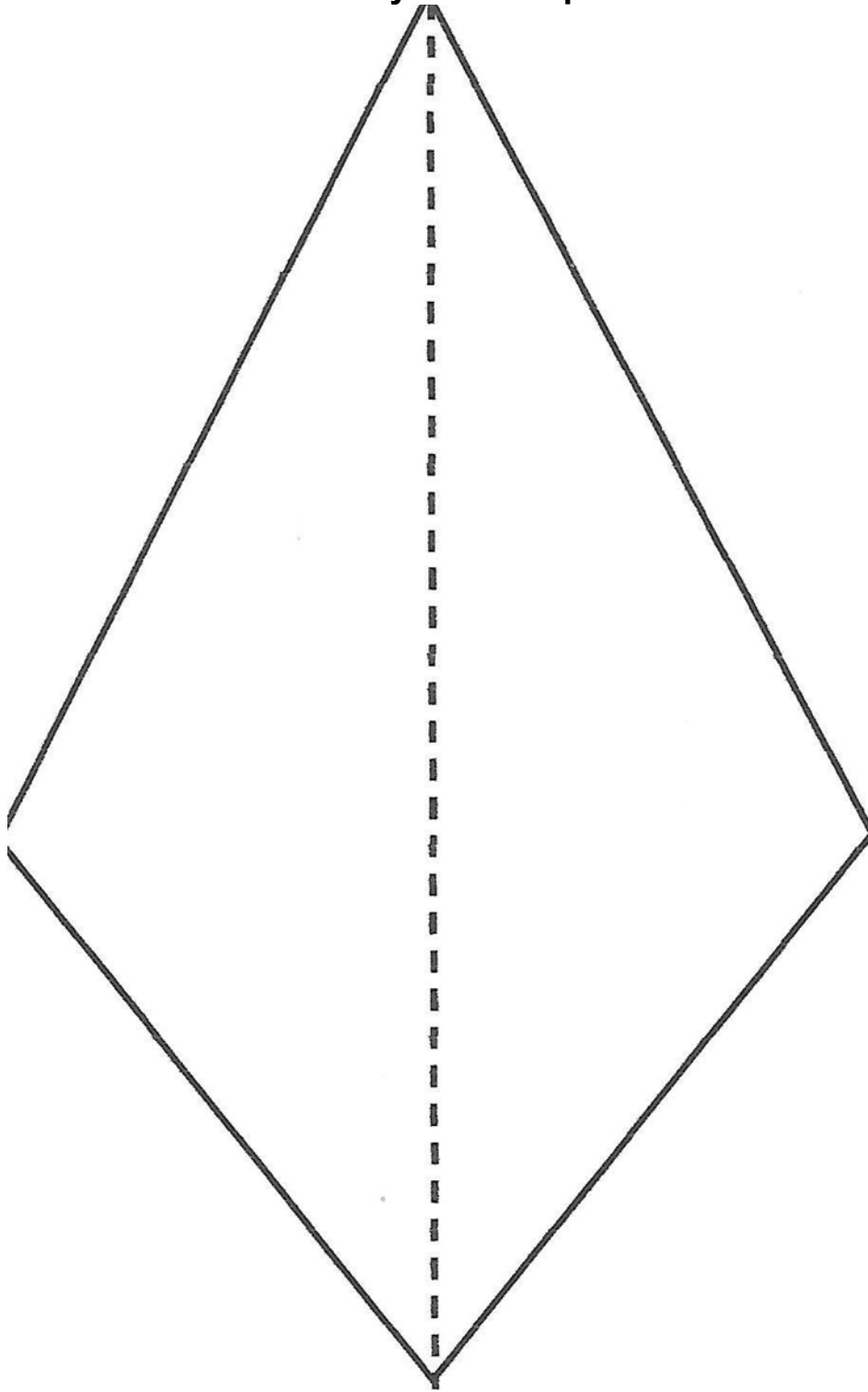
- > Fuse Fleece to WRONG-side of Star Backing.
- > With RIGHT-sides together, pinned Star to Backing.
- > Sandwich the Fleece, Backing, & Star.
- > Using a 1/4" seam, sew around Star, Pivoting where Points seams are joined.
- > Backstitch at beginning & end; leaving an opening to turn Star RIGHT-side out.
- > Clip Points & inseams to allow Star to lay flat.
- > Turn Star RIGHT-side out; Press; Whipstitch the opening closed; Topstitch as desired.

4th of July Star Template



Grilled Peach-Chicken Salad
July 2025
by Jinx Abernathy

Time: 25 Minutes Serves: 4

Ingredients:

1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breast
salt & pepper to season
6 cups baby spinach
2 peaches, halved
1 teaspoon grape seed oil (avocado or canola would work too)
1/2 cup blueberries
1/4 cup sliced red onion
1/4 cup pecan halves
1 ounce crumbled goat cheese
basil, for garnish



Honey Mustard Dressing:

1 tablespoon course ground mustard
1 tablespoon dijon mustard
1 tablespoon honey
1 tablespoon apple cider vinegar
salt & pepper

Directions:

1. Preheat grill to medium high heat.
2. Season chicken with salt and pepper on both sides.
3. Lightly brush peach flesh with grape seed oil.
4. Place chicken on grill grates and grill each side for 5-7 minutes, or until chicken is no longer pink. (depending on thickness)
5. Place peaches on grill grates flesh side down. Grill for 3-4 minutes, or until there are grill marks.
6. Remove both chicken and peaches from grill and let rest.
7. In the meantime, to a small bowl add course ground mustard, dijon mustard, honey, apple cider vinegar, salt and pepper. Whisk to mix everything together. Set aside.
8. Assemble Salad: to a large bowl add spinach, blueberries, red onion, goat cheese, pecans. Slice chicken and peaches and top the salad. Serve with dressing on the side.

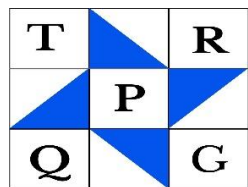
