## Challenge: Foundation Paper Piecing

Try a new technique, or add to the skills you already have, with Foundation Paper Piecing.

### What Is FPP?

Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP) is a quilting technique where a printed paper template guides fabric placement and stitching to create precise quilt blocks. The fabric is sewn onto the paper, and the paper is removed after the block is completed.

The criteria is simple.

Use whatever combination of colors and pattern(s) you like.

Size: at least 24 inches Square

Must be made using foundation paper piecing Technique. (definition above)

Finished quilts must be submitted at the December TRPQG meeting.

## 2025 Mystery Quilt Clue 5

### Cutting:

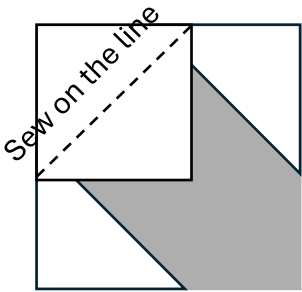
From the background fabric, cut 42 squares 3.5 x 3.5 inch. Keep leftover fabric after each clue – you may need it later!

Also, get your Clue 3 blocks, we will be working with those.

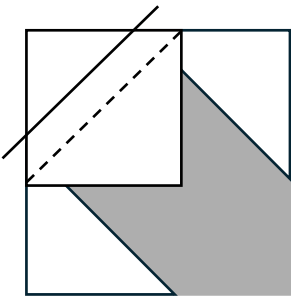
### Piecing:

**Step 1:** Mark a light pencil diagonal line on the wrong side of the background squares.

**Step 2:** Match one background square with one of the remaining corners of the Clue 3 block. Sew on the marked line.

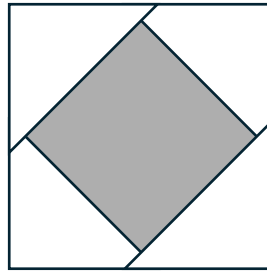


**Step 3:** Fold the background square away on the sewn line. Press. Cut off excess fabric leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch of seam allowance.



**Step 4:** Repeat with another background square on the opposite corner Clue 3 block.

**Finished block:**



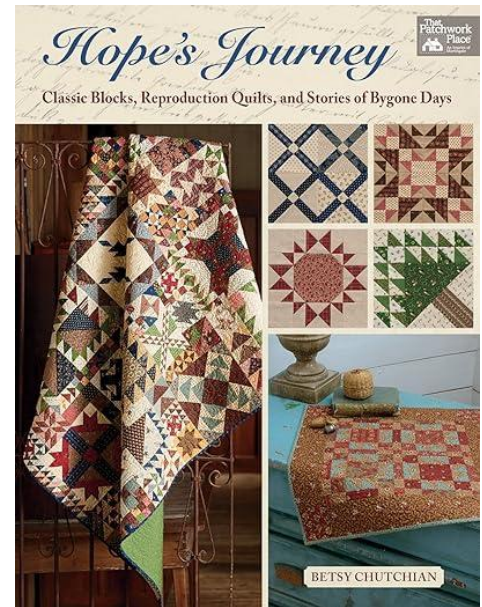
Finish 21 blocks. Put blocks in a ziplock bag marked Clue 5.

## Book Review

### Hope's Journey

### Classic Blocks, Reproduction Quilts and Stories of Bygone Days By Betsy Chutchian

Hope's Journey is a book of classic blocks and reproduction quilts. It was written by Betsy Churchian. The author feels that every woman who leaves home faces an uncertain future. All have hope for a better life. Frontier women who traveled west had no idea what the future held. Neither did those who left home to escape religious freedom or famine (much like those in the mountains who lost their homes during our recent hurricane). The author said that the patterns in this book were presented to her students as mystery quilts. The students had no idea what to expect, but they accepted that and persevered. The quilter using this book will know what to expect. The book has sampler quilts and miniquilts. Various techniques and alternatives are suggested for each quilt. There are twelve patterns given. Some are given for various sized quilts. The first one in the book, for example, gives directions for a 10" block, a 6" block, or a 12 ½" x 12 ½" quilt (with 3" x 3" blocks). One of my favorites is entitled Chick, Chick, Chick Hen. It is a 15 ½" x 15 ½" quilt. Old Maid's Ramble has directions for 14" blocks, 4" blocks, or a 12 ½" x 12 ½" quilt (the finished blocks are 1" x 1").



There is a pattern for a 16" Feathered Star. I think I might try this (one block!). I have always wanted to make a feathered star block but didn't think I was an accurate enough quilter to make it. I might give it a try for one block! Won't you join me?

This is a beautiful book with many helpful pictures and suggestions. We all need to grow in our quilting abilities. This book gives you a good excuse to grow.

At our August meeting, Lee Monroe will host a workshop from 10AM – 4PM. The cost is \$30 and will include a pattern for the workshop. Here is a supply list for the workshop.

#### Fabric Supplies:

- Use the pattern chart for fabric needs for the size quilt you desire.
- Bring at least 1/3 yard of two prints and 1/2 yard of background to class.

#### Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary Cutter
- Ruler (8 1/2 x 12 1/2 or similar recommended)

#### Optional Supplies\*

- Bloc Loc 2 x 4" Flying Geese Ruler
- Bloc Loc 4 x 8" Flying Geese Ruler
- 12" or similar rotating mat

May Chappell Cane Creek Quilt Pattern

Traditional Sewing Supplies: Snips, Pins, Seam Ripper, etc.

\* Bring these flying geese bloc loc rulers if you already own them. You may also bring any other flying geese trimming tools you have. There will be rulers at class for you to try; there is no need to purchase prior to class.

## CUT PRIOR TO CLASS

You will need at least 1/3 yard of two prints and 1/2 yard of background for class.

#### Prints

- (4) 5 1/2" Square of Print A
- (1) 9 1/2" Squares of Print B

#### Background

- (16) 3 1/8" Squares
- (4) 5 1/8" Squares

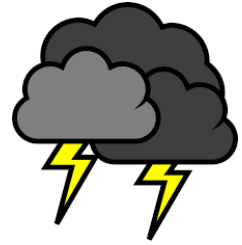

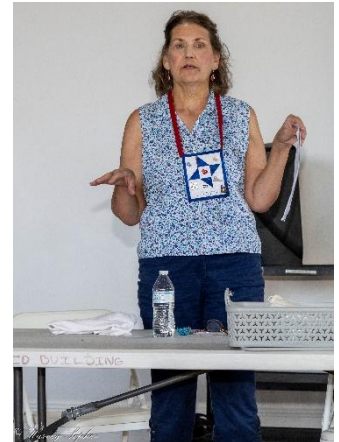

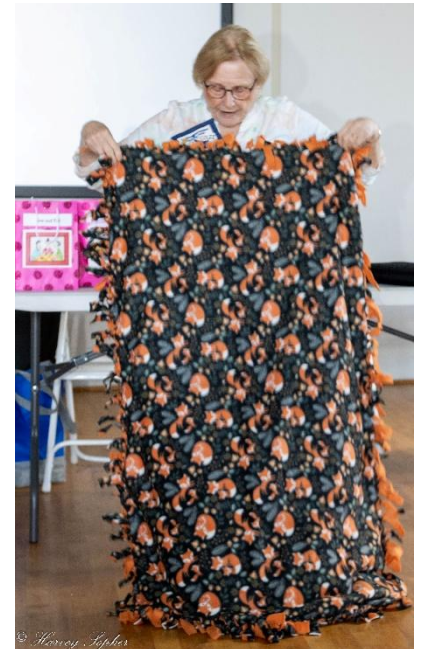

## QUILTOLGY – August 2025

### Sunflower Mug Rug - approximately 12"

#### Supplies for 12" Mug Rug:

- (4) Yellow Prints
- (1) Brown Print Fabric, 7" square
- 12" square Fusible Fleece
- 10" x 16" Lightweight Fusible Interfacing
- 13" square Backing Fabric
- Sewing Machine & Basic Sewing Tools

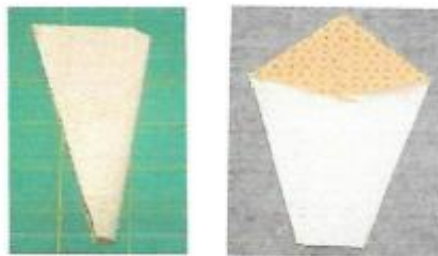


#### STEP-1: Prepare the Fabric:

- > Using the Dresden "Petal" Template, cut 3-petals from each yellow fabric, for a total of 12 petals.
- > Using the Flower Center Template, cut a circle from the Brown Print Fabric, & set aside.
- > Cut a 12" square from the Backing Fabric & set aside.

#### STEP-2: Make the Petals:

- > Fold each Petal in half, lengthwise, with RIGHT-side-together.
- > Sew a ¼" seam across the top, backstitching at each end.
- > Clip the corner on the folded side of the Petal.
- > Turn Petal RIGHT side out, ensuring the point is completely pushed out.
- > Center the seam & press.



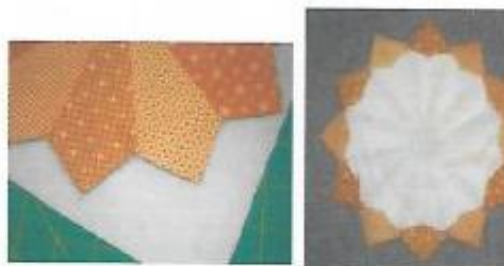
#### STEP-3: Make the Flower:

- > Lining up the long edges of the Petals, arrange them in a circle, in the order way you want them.
- > Join each Petal with a ¼" seam allowance, being sure to backstitch at the beginning & end.
- > Press all seams open.



#### STEP-4: Fuse the Fleece:

- > Carefully trace the Flower onto the Fusible Fleece.
- > Cut just inside the traced line. Clip about ¼" between each "valley".
- > With fusible side of fleece facing WRONG-side of flower, tuck each point into each petal.
- > Fuse Fleece to Flower, being careful NOT to iron over the exposed Fleece in the center of the Flower.
- > Topstich the Flower as desired.



#### STEP-5: Flower Center:

- > Trace the Center Circle Template onto the Lightweight Fusible Interfacing.
- > Place the fusible side of the Interfacing toward the RIGHT-side of the Flower center.
- > Sew on the traced line, overlapping a few stitches to complete the circle.
- > Cut ¼" away from the stitching line, around the entire circle.
- > To turn the Center Circle RIGHT-side out, carefully pull the Interfacing away from the fabric & cut a small "Y"-shape in the middle of the interfacing.



> Turn the entire Flower through the "Y"-shaped hole.

**STEP-6: Set the Flower Center:**

- > Place the Flower Center in the middle of the Petals & fuse in place, according to product instructions.
- > Top stitch as desired.




**STEP-7: The Backing:**

- > Place the Flower Center in the middle of the Petals & fuse in place, according to product instructions.






SUNFLOWER

Time: 5 minutes Makes: 1+1/2 cup

1/2 cups ice cubes

1/4 cup cold heavy cream

1/4 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice (from 2 medium lemons)

1/4 cup sweetened condensed milk

Whipped cream, for topping (optional)

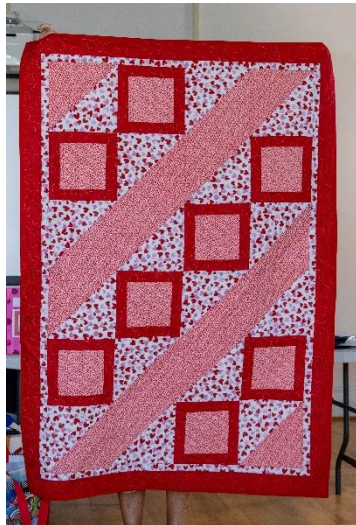
Lemon slice, for garnish (optional)



### Directions:

Put your glass in the freezer a few minutes before preparing your drink  
Place the ice cubes, heavy cream, lemon juice, sweetened condensed milk in a blender, preferably high-speed. Using the tamper if needed, blend until smooth, about 1 minute.

Pour into a glass, pop in a straw, & drink it as is, garnish with whipped cream & a lemon slice if desired.

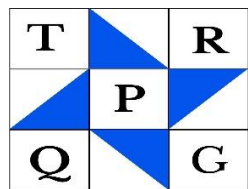

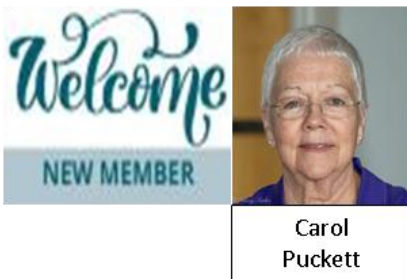
